### Stress First Aid Program



Last month we launched our newest member benefit, the [Stress First Aid \(SFA\) program](#), and received an overwhelmingly positive response. **SFA offers a set of supportive actions that promote self-care and peer support**, enabling teams to identify and mitigate the negative impacts of stress at work before they impair staff health and wellbeing. The SFA model is based on five evidence-informed factors that help people recover from stress and adversity: the need for safety, calm, connection, a sense of competence or self-efficacy, and hope.

**SFA is available free of charge as a benefit of your organization's Schwartz Center membership.**

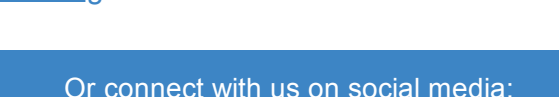

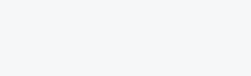
